Level I and II should identify five (5) breeds of any of the four (4) livestock specie(s). Points: Five (5) points per answer – 25 total points

Level III and IV should identify five (5) breeds and descriptions of any of the four (4) livestock specie(s).

Points: Five (5) points per correct answer - 25 total points If level III or IV contestant misses the breed or description, they will receive half credit. (2.5 points)
